Ghanaian (and African) Agriculture: what needs to change?

- Profitability
- Productivity
- Market (Product Quality, Access)

- 40% of Ghana's workforce, but only 20% of GDP
- Could increase output 5 fold with existing good practice
- The world has changed food security will be a huge concern



Agronomic challenges faced by crop farmers

The current synthetic inputs model is breaking down. Let's leapfrog!

- Cycle of needing more to achieve less, so falling profitability
- Effects on soil, water, and quality
- Health concerns for farmers and consumers

Organic solutions (traditional and novel) sound good, but many are not effective

HJA Africa – the story so far

Once upon a time (8 years ago).....

The HJA Africa Organic Farming Aid (OFA) Opportunity

- OFA is a wood vinegar (note every wood vinegar is different!)
- Wood is sourced from a FSC certified plantation in Ghana
- 100% biodegradable, non toxic and food safe.
- Applied diluted at between 1:200 and 1:1000.
- Master of many trades! Fertiliser, Pesticide, Fungicide
- Incredibly cost effective
- Can be produced at scale

Roots and Tubers

Benefits to the Farmer

- Reduce costs
- Improve crop yield and quality
- Solve some major pest issues such as Fall Armyworm
- Avoid issues with preharvest interval (eg phytophthora)
- Increase profitability
- Reduce or eliminate chemical residues
- Help restore soil and water course quality
- Protect health of farm's staff and its customers



Leads to wider benefits for society as well as for the farmer
